






<p>1</p> 	<p>This first hole features a 45 yard wide fairway without any bunkers. If you can place the tee shot on the left side of the landing area, this green will receive your approach shot with a wide opening.</p>
<p>2</p> 	<p>Another golfer friendly fairway without bunkers. The approach shot to the green is where you want to pay attention. Too far away from the pin, and you may have to deal with some of the rolling contour of the green.</p>
<p>3</p> 	<p>An accurately placed tee shot is a must for this par 4. Fairway bunkers protect the right side of the landing area with the best position just to the left of these bunkers. The approach to the green is protected on the right by a bunker, and on the left by a grassy swale.</p>
<p>4</p> 	<p>A picturesque downhill tee shot to an angled green, sloping front to back. A missed shot to the right will be swallowed by a huge bunker.</p>
<p>5</p> 	<p>This right to left bending, bunkerless par 4 can be compromised by a tee shot down the left side. A long, narrow green awaits your arrival.</p>
<p>6</p>	<p>A bunker on the left of the second landing area will present the option of lying up short of it, or hitting over it to have the best angle into the green. Bunkers at the right front and left side protect the green.</p>
<p>7</p>	<p>A longish tee shot that misses the right side fairway bunker is a must. Even then, a very demanding, uphill approach shot needs to avoid the cavernous front bunkers.</p>
<p>8</p>	<p>This second par 5 is a long down hill. Because of the down hill shot, shortening the distance, sufficient bunkering has been added to make this one of the most challenging par-fives on the course.</p>
<p>9</p>	<p>If you can land your tee shot close to the large trees on the left of the landing areas, an ideal angle into the green will exist. A support slope on the back of the green allows for a bold shot into this shallow green.</p>



RULES OF PLAY

USGA Rules Govern All Play.

- Water hazard defined by yellow stakes/lines.
- Lateral water hazard defined by red stakes/lines.
- Boundary fences and white stakes define out of bounds.
- Yardage Markers:
 - All yardages measured to the center of the green.

SPEED OF PLAY

- Four hour golf reminders:
 - Keep pace with group ahead.
- Play "ready" golf (Be ready to hit when it is your turn).
- Carry extra clubs when leaving your cart.
- Line up putts while others are putting.
- Mark scores at next tee.

ETIQUETTE

- Proper attire must be worn at all times.
- Soft spikes required.
- Players are reminded to please repair your ball mark and one other, fill all divots with sand mixture and rake bunkers smooth.
